## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

This bill expands the eligibility of municipalities to receive payments from the Department under the Fire Dues Program. Under this bill, a municipality may be eligible to receive payments from the Department if they are in substantial compliance with the requirement that every public building and place of employment be inspected. This bill requires the Department to determine by rule, the definition of substantial compliance. The Department estimates that the code development work will require approximately 200 hours of labor to write the necessary rules to comply with the requirements of the bill. These costs are estimated at \$9,800. It is likely that the Department will be able to absorb these costs within its existing budgets, and will likely not seek a supplement.
