DATCP Draft Legislation

- AN ACT to renumber 95.55(3), 95.68(4) and 97.22(2)(b); and to create 20.115(2)(gm),
- 2 95.36(10), 95.51, 95.55(3)(b), 95.68(4)(b) and 97.22(2)(b)1. of the statutes; relating to:
- 3 livestock premises registration, identification and fees.

Analysis Prepared by the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection

The department of agriculture, trade and consumer protection (DATCP) currently administers animal health and food safety programs, including programs to control serious diseases of livestock. DATCP currently licenses dairy farmers, animal market operators and keepers of farm-raised deer.

This bill requires persons who keep livestock in this state to register annually with DATCP. Registrants must pay fees to support a livestock premises identification program. This bill applies to persons who keep bovine animals (cattle and bison), sheep, the missing goats, swine or farm-raised deer (captive deer and elk) and other animals that DATCP will be identifies by rule. It also applies to persons keeping more than 50 poultry animals or more than 5 horses.

This bill requires DATCP to establish a livestock premises identification program, and establish registration fees by rule to cover the reasonable cost of the program. DATCP must assign a unique premises identification number to each registered livestock location. DATCP must create an electronic database of livestock premises, including premises identification numbers and related information.

Dairy farmers licensed under s. 97.22, Stats., animal market operators licensed under s. 95.68, Stats., and keepers of farm-raised deer registered under s. 95.55, Stats., are exempt from annual registration under this bill (because they are already licensed annually). But they must be included in the livestock premises identification program, and must pay supplementary annual license fees to help support the program. The supplementary annual fees are equivalent to the annual registration fees under this bill.

Registration information filed with DATCP under this bill is protected from disclosure under the state open records law, except as otherwise provided by DATCP rule. This bill does not affect the disclosure, under the state open records law, of information that a livestock owner is required to file with DATCP under current law.

Persons, other than dairy farmers, who fail to comply with this bill are subject to penalties currently provided under s. 95.99, Stats. These include a criminal fine of up to \$1,000 or a jail sentence of up to 6 months, or both. In lieu of a criminal penalty, a court may order a violator to pay a civil forfeiture of up to \$5,000 per violation. DATCP may also seek a court injunction to restrain continued violations.

Dairy farmers who fail to comply with this bill are subject to penalties currently provided under s. 97.72 and 97.73, Stats. These include a criminal fine of up to \$1,000 or a jail sentence of up to 6 months, or both, for a first offense. For a subsequent offense, there is a criminal fine of up to \$5,000 or a jail sentence of up to one year, or both. In lieu of a criminal penalty, a court may order a violator to pay a civil forfeiture of up to \$1,000 per violation. DATCP may also seek a court injunction to restrain continued violations.

DATCP may deny, suspend or revoke the license or registration of a dairy farmer, animal market operator or farm-raised deer keeper who fails to comply with this bill. This bill also prohibits DATCP from paying indemnities for animals that DATCP condemns for disease control purposes under ch. 95, Stats., if the animal owner has failed to comply with this bill.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) conducts various activities to protect animal health and food safety. DATCP licenses dairy farmers and operators of livestock markets and registers persons who keep deer (including elk).

This bill requires certain persons who keep livestock in this state to register annually with DATCP and to pay a fee. For the purposes of this bill, "livestock" means cattle and bison, horses, goats, poultry, sheep, swine, deer, and any other kind of animal that DATCP identifies by rule. To be covered by this bill, a person keeping poultry must have more than 50 animals and a person keeping horses must have than animals. The bill does not require dairy farmers and livestock market/operators that are more than animals.

licensed and deer keepers who are registered under currently to obtain the new registration, but they are required to pay the new fee.

The bill requires DATCP to assign a premises identification number to each location where livestock are kept and to maintain a data base containing the identification numbers and related information. Information provided to DATCP under this bill is not public information, except as provided by DATCP by rule and except for information that is required to be provided to DATON under other laws.

Under current law, DATCP makes payments to owners of animals that DATCP orders killed to control animal disease. Current law specifies several situations in



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which owners are not eligible for these payments. Under this bill, the owner of an animal that DATCP orders to be killed to control animal disease is not eligible for a payment from DATCP if the person did not register or pay a fee as required by the bill.

I'm trying to get in touch with Neil Hammerschmidt of the Wisconsin Livestock Identification Consortium, as he should be able to answer your questions.

I think my statement about federal numbers being currently available was misleading. As I understand it, the federal government has just recently developed a national premise identification allocator that will assign states sequential numbers for registered premises. The reasoning behind the national system is to avoid duplication of numbers in the states. This system is essentially a database of numbers, which the department will have the ability to assign. As producers register their premises, they would be assigned a number from the federal system.

Would the problem be addressed if the last two sentences of that paragraph were combined to say... "The department shall use a system of federal identification numbers to facilitate animal health and disease control, interstate consistency, and interstate commerce."

If you think this can work, great. Otherwise, I will have Neil touch base with you in the next day or so to address your questions.
