Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the Department of Commerce (department) may award grants to a technology-based nonprofit organization to provide support for a manufacturing extension center, if the organization submits to the department a plan detailing its proposed expenditures and performance measures related to the project for which the organization is seeking a grant and the department approves the plan. The department may not award more than \$1,000,000 in such grants in a fiscal year. In addition, a technology-based nonprofit organization that receives a manufacturing extension center grant is not eligible to receive a technology development grant or loan from the Wisconsin development fund.

This bill increases funding for manufacturing extension center grants to \$1,000,000 in fiscal year 2003-04 and provides that, beginning with fiscal year 2004-05, the department may award \$1,500,000 in such grants in each fiscal year. The bill also allows a technology-based nonprofit organization that receives a manufacturing extension center grant to be eligible for a technology development grant or loan.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

ASSEMBLY BILL 859**SECTION 1**

1 **SECTION 1.** 560.25 (3) of the statutes is repealed.

2 **SECTION 2.** 560.25 (4) of the statutes is amended to read:

3 560.25 (4) LIMIT ON GRANTS. The Beginning with fiscal year 2004-05, the
4 department may ~~not~~ award ~~more than \$1,000,000~~ \$1,500,000 in grants under this
5 section in ~~a~~ each fiscal year.

6 **SECTION 3. Appropriation changes.**

7 (1) MANUFACTURING EXTENSION CENTER GRANTS. In the schedule under section
8 20.005 (3) of the statutes for the appropriation to the department of commerce under
9 section 20.143 (1) (f) of the statutes, as affected by the acts of 2003, the dollar amount
10 is increased by \$900,000 for fiscal year 2003-04 and the dollar amount is increased
11 by \$1,400,000 for fiscal year 2004-05 to increase funding for the purpose for which
12 the appropriation is made.

1 under 2001 Wisconsin Act 16, section 9110 (7g), for the grants under 2003 Wisconsin
2 Act 33, section 9109 (1d) and (2q), and for reimbursements under s. 560.167. No
3 moneys may be encumbered under this paragraph for grants under s. 560.25 after
4 June 30, 2003.”.

5 **2.** Page 2, line 1: delete “SECTION 1” and substitute “SECTION 1m”.

6 **3.** Page 2, line 7: after “GRANTS.” insert:

7 “(a)”.

8 **4.** Page 2, line 10: delete “\$900,000” and substitute “\$750,000”.

9 **5.** Page 2, line 11: delete “\$1,400,000” and substitute “750,000”.

10 **6.** Page 2, line 12: after that line insert:

11 “(b) In the schedule under section 20.005 (3) of the statutes for the
12 appropriation to the department of commerce under section 20.143 (1) (c) of the
13 statutes, as affected by the acts of 2003, the dollar amount is decreased by \$1,500,000
14 for fiscal year 2003–04 to decrease funding for the purpose for which the
15 appropriation is made.”.
