If the chairpersons of JCF did not notify DNR within 14 days after the date of the DNR's notification that JCF had scheduled a meeting to review the proposed activity, DNR could obligate the money. If the cochairpersons notified DNR that JCF had scheduled a meeting to review the proposed activity, DNR could obligate the money only if JCF approved the proposed activity.

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
