Todd,

I have had a chance to review this more carefully now, so here are a few comments. I just read it as new text--I did not compare it to earlier versions. My comments are technical, not related to the policy.

Page 2, lines 4-7: If the request is made by the Speaker or by the presiding officer of the Senate, to whom does the PSC submit the report? (Same comment I made earlier.)

Page 3, line 11: Why should the report be sent to the Legislative Council Staff? What would we do with it? The subject of the report is not related to the subject of the report that we prepare on proposed rules, so it would not be useful to us for that, and in many cases it would not be prepared until after our report is completed. We would get the report eventually, when the rule is sent to the Legislature for final review, since it becomes an appendix.

Page 4, line 4: I assume that the "statement" referred to on that line is the "energy impact report" referred to on line 2. If that is the case, it would appear that the word "statement" should be replaced by "report," or if there is concern about confusion about what report is meant (since that sentence also refers to another report), then by "energy impact report." (How's that for picking nits?)
