## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

Wisconsin allows for a deduction of \$3,000 from federal adjusted gross income (FAGI) for contributions made to an EdVest account, a college tuition and expenses program, if the beneficiary is one of the following: the claimant, the claimant's dependent, or the claimant's grandchild. The proposed bill would allow the deduction when the beneficiary is the claimant's great-grandchild, niece, or nephew.

According to EdVest, aunts, uncles, and great-grandparents opened about 600 new accounts in 2002. Assuming an additional 600 new accounts are opened annually by aunts, uncles, and great-grandparents, contributions made to these accounts would be about \$430,000 annually. Assuming an effective marginal tax rate of 5.5%, the fiscal effect of this bill would be about \$24,000 (\$430,000 x .055).

The fiscal effect may be slightly understated, as the data does not include the Tomorrow's Scholar accounts portion of the EdVest program. More than 95% of all Tomorrow's Scholar accounts are owned by non-residents and the revenue impact to the state is minimal.

The Department would incur minimal administrative costs that could be absorbed within the agency's budget.
