**Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

This bill would increase the amount of information that a juvenile's school could obtain from various law enforcement and social welfare agencies. In addition, the bill would allow a school board to disclose pupil records to various agencies for the purpose of providing services to the pupil under certain defined circumstances. Finally, the bill provides that records created and maintained by a law enforcement unit of a school district treat these records as law enforcement officers' records of juveniles.

It is not possible to determine if the changes in this bill will result in increased costs for local juvenile justice agencies.

**Long-Range Fiscal Implications**
