Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill authorizes the creation of a Senior Court program for adult offenders who commit their crime when they were less than 25 years of age. The offender shall not be confined during the offender's successful participation in the program and the offender will not be under the supervision of the Department of Corrections. Thus, this program may reduce the number of offenders confined to county jails for these types of offenses and may reduce the number of offenders who would normally be placed under the supervision of the Department.

The Department is unable to determine the amount of the reduction in local confinement costs. The Department is also unable to determine the number of offenders who will participate in the Senior Court program instead of being placed on probation and supervised by the Department of Corrections.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications
