Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

DER is unable to determine local government costs related to AB 189.

Not all local governments currently require residency of employees or prospective employees. For these governments, this legislation would cause no change.

For those local governments currently requiring residency of employees or prospective employees this bill might increase the available pool of candidates for staff positions and so reduce the number of recruitments necessary to find able staff.

The bill might increase the distribution of advertisements that a local government finds necessary to recruit qualified staff. Instead of advertising only within a locality, an employer government may feel it needs to advertise more widely.

This bill could affect labor relations in the next contract period because the bill makes residency requirements a prohibited subject of bargaining.
