Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law DHFS must, in developing and implementing a statewide trauma care system, seek the advice of the 13 member trauma advisory council. The Statewide Trauma Advisory Council terminates on July 1, 2003.

Currently, regional trauma councils are forming and the Statewide Trauma Advisory Council is providing advice on the rules, hospital involvement, data collection and other implementation needs. As the statewide trauma system matures, the functions of the Statewide Trauma Advisory Council will change but will still be needed to provide technical advice.

Assembly Bill 281 eliminates the July 1, 2003 termination of the statewide trauma advisory council. Eliminating the termination date will allow the Council to continue to meet and provide advice and technical assistance regarding the development of the statewide trauma system. It is estimated that the Council costs approximately \$8,000 a year for meeting and travel expenses. The Department has not received any funding in the past to support the Council. The Department will continue to fund the expenses of the Council within its existing budget.
