Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This legislation requires local election officials to complete a review of election day voter registration changes within 30 days following an election. Currently only 320 municipalities have voter registration. Based on information received from municipal clerks, this will be difficult to accomplish. Following a presidential election, larger municipalities will have to contract for additional assistance to complete the work in a timely manner. In that case, the review coincides with a number of key year end responsibilities such as the preparation of tax bills. The City of Milwaukee currently contracts for this service, no information is available on the cost.

Local law enforcement will also have to reprioritize their investigative efforts. Currently referrals from local election officials receive little or no attention.

The State Elections Board will need to revise its information and training materials to reflect the changes. The agency will also have to conduct an information and training program for local election officials.

The revision of information and training materials will cost approximately \$10,000 for development, printing and distribution. The information and training program will cost approximately \$20,000 to reach the intended audience.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications
