Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law, Chapter 45.43 (5)Wis. Stats., the county veteran service officers provide information and assistance to persons who have served in the U.S. armed forces regarding any benefits to which they may be entitled.

This bill would require county veteran service officers to provide the same type of services to members of the National Guard and of a reserve unit. This bill would also include dependents. Currently, the county veterans' service officers act as a point of reference in assisting national guardsmen and reservist to obtain any entitled benefits. Based on current law, and assuming the county veteran service officer continues to be a place of referral, there would be little, if any, fiscal impact as a result of this bill.
