## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

This bill requires state agencies to promulgate rules establishing periods within which the agencies intend to approve or disapprove applications for specified licenses, permits, and other approvals. A number of Department of Administration activities would be subject to the creation of such rules including state facilities for the support of the Building Commission, state facilities for the administration of construction contracts and for staffing the State Capitol and Executive Residence Board, state agency services for the support of the Public Records Board, electronic technology for computer related items, and the Division of Gaming for gaming regulation. Until rules are written and applied, it is not known whether they would increase or decrease costs to state agencies or applicants. There would be staff costs to the Department as a result of redirecting efforts to write rules to comply with this bill.
