Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill creates a new crime. There is no data by which to know the number of additional cases this will cause to be referred by law enforcement to the District Attorneys' Offices. Potentially, the number of opportunities for this crime to take place is extremely large. For example, another person prepares most lunches eaten during the workweek by employees. Even food prepared by a person in his or her own home to be eaten by that person normally would include ingredients that were prepared by others.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

The actual number of cases that are charge under this statute were it to become law would have to be monitored carefully to determine if additional prosecutorial resources are needed.
