### Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill would allow the maximum term for imprisonment for unlawfully distributing or delivering a controlled substance or for unlawfully possessing a controlled substance with intent to deliver or distribute it to be increased up to five years under two conditions. The two conditions under which the imprisonment term could be increased are 1)if the person committed the offense at a residential building while a child is present, or 2)if the person used a vehicle to facilitate the commission of the offense and a child is in or on the vehicle while the person committed it.

During calendar year 2002 approximately 1,300 people were admitted to adult correctional institutions after having been convicted of these offenses. It is not possible to determine how many of these offenders would have been found guilty of committing these crimes while a child was present under the conditions required to increase the prison term or how long their prison term would have been extended. However, the FY02 annual cost to house an inmate in a Department of Corrections institution is approximately \$26,000.

This bill should not affect local government costs because the imprisonment would be in an adult correctional institution, and not in a local jail.
