Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

In years when the closing date is later than March 1, the Department will be required to add to existing creel surveys that traditionally ended on March 1. The number of additional days will vary between 0 and 6, thus on average 3 days (24 hrs). Given that those days will always be a weekend, a creel clerk would be working each of those days. A creel clerk's salary is approximately \$10 per hour. The Department averages creel surveys on 20 lakes per year, at \$10/hr for 24 hrs per lake at a total cost on average of approximately \$4,800, ranging from \$0 to \$9,600. In addition, there would be costs for travel to and from sites and for supplies (i.e. boat gas and oil). Assuming an average of 25 miles round trip per day at \$0.26/mile for 3 days = \$19.50. Assuming the boat uses 5 gallons of gas and a quart of oil per day at \$1.75/gallon and \$2.00 per quart = \$32.25 on average.

In addition, the Department may have to contract for annual programming changes to current creel survey software each year to modify ending dates. This is likely to be less than \$400.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

These costs would be incurred annually.
