Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

2003 SB 417 increases the overall length for a 2-vehicle combination transporting livestock without a permit from 65 feet to 75 feet and does not restrict operation of the longer 2-vehicle combination to specific roads. This would allow the tractor of the two-vehicle combination transporting livestock to increase in length while retaining the 48' to 53' trailer length requirement as identified in s.348.07(g) and s.348.07(gr), Wis. Stats., depending upon the length of the kingpin to axle.

There is minimal fiscal effect on the Department of Transportation and on state and local revenue if SB 417 is implemented.

There are few two-vehicle combinations that transport livestock that currently request permit for operations, so revenue loss for the Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) from eliminationg a permit for the 75' two vehicle combinations is negligible.

State Patrol citations for all overlength vehicles totaled \$68,387 in 2002. The State Patrol writes approximately 90% of all overlength citations statewide, and estimates that less than 5% of those citations are written on livestock 2-vehicle combinations. Thus, the estimated revenue loss to the state, counties and school fund from writing fewer citations for overlength livestock 2-vehicle combinations is estimated to be less than \$3500 annually. The number of possible overlength citations for livestock 2-vehicle combinations that could be written for over 75' in length is indeterminable.

Additionally, the State Patrol and other law enforcement agencies would enforce the new law as part of their routine tasks and routine training.

Since the proposal does not increase permitted weights, the additional length does not add to the deterioration of Wisconsin roads.
