2003 Wisconsin Act 82 provides that, if school attendance is a condition of a dispositional order of the juvenile court or of a municipal court for a person who is truant or habitually truant, the order must specify what constitutes a violation of the condition and must direct the school board of the school district, or the governing body of the private school, in which the person is enrolled to notify the juvenile court or municipal court, or, if the person is under the supervision of an agency, to notify the agency, of any violation of that condition.

2003 Wisconsin Act 82 requires a municipal court to open its records of a juvenile for inspection as a juvenile court would (subject to the same exceptions). Also, Act 82 requires a juvenile court to open its records of a juvenile for inspection by a municipal court, city, village, or town attorney, or attorney or guardian ad litem for a party for purposes of proceedings in that municipal court.

Effective Date: The effective date of 2003 Wisconsin Act 82 is December 6, 2003.
