



2003 ASSEMBLY BILL 584

October 15, 2003 – Introduced by Representatives SCHNEIDER and HAHN. Referred to Committee on Judiciary.

1 **AN ACT** *to renumber* 910.01 (1); *to amend* 910.01 (2); and *to create* 910.01 (1g)
2 and 910.025 of the statutes; **relating to:** admissibility of a digitally produced
3 photograph, film, audio, or video.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, if properly authenticated as being a true representation of the image in the photograph or motion picture, an original of a photograph or motion picture may be admitted in evidence to prove the content of the photograph or motion picture. This bill prohibits the introduction of a photograph, film, motion picture, audio, or video of a person, place, document, sound, or event to prove the content of the photograph, film, motion picture, audio, or video if that photograph, film, motion picture, audio, or video is created or stored by data in the form of numerical digits. The prohibition under this bill does not apply to the use of such digital representations in actions to enforce a crime related to child pornography.
