



## 2003 ASSEMBLY BILL 695

December 5, 2003 – Introduced by Representatives JOHNSRUD, HAHN, PETROWSKI, MUSSER, ALBERS, TOWNS, HINES, TOWNSEND, STONE, FREESE, LOTHIAN, WARD and GRONEMUS, cosponsored by Senators SCHULTZ and WELCH. Referred to Committee on Highway Safety.

1     **AN ACT to create** 348.07 (2) (im) of the statutes; **relating to:** trailers used to  
2     transport livestock.

### *Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau*

Under current law, with limited exceptions, no one may operate a single vehicle that exceeds 40 feet in length without obtaining a permit from the Department of Transportation.

This bill creates an exception for a two-vehicle combination that is used to transport livestock and that does not exceed 75 feet in length.

3     **SECTION 1.** 348.07 (2) (im) of the statutes is created to read:  
4     348.07 (2) (im) Seventy-five total feet for a 2-vehicle combination transporting  
5     livestock.
