1 **Relating to:** commending the life of Irvin Favre.

2 Whereas, Irvin Favre, resident of Kiln, Mississippi, and father of beloved Green
3 Bay Packer quarterback Brett Favre, died suddenly on December 21, 2003, at the
4 young age of 58; and

5 Whereas, Irvin Favre graduated from Gulfport High School in 1963; and he
6 then played baseball at Southern Miss, lettering in 1966-67; and

7 Whereas, he married his wife, Bonita, and the couple had 4 children, Jeff, Brett,
8 Scott, and Brandi; and

9 Whereas, Irvin was an outstanding high school teacher and coach for 28 years;
10 and he coached football and baseball on the Gulf Coast, first at St. John, then at
11 Hancock North Central, where he coached his 3 sons; and

12 Whereas, he returned to coaching with the Mississippi Fire Dogs, an indoor
13 minor league football team, and led the team to a National Indoor Football League
14 Championship; and
