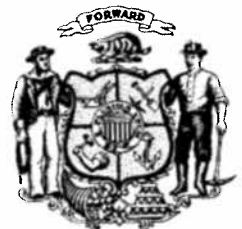

**Testimony on Assembly Bill 235
State Representative Mark Pettis
May 13, 2003
Assembly Committee on Forestry**

Good Morning. Thank you for the opportunity to testify before you today on Assembly Bill 235.

The purpose of this legislation is to protect forest landowners from loggers who fail to compensate for timber cut from lands with the owners' consent. Presently, landowners' only option in this situation is to handle the non-payment through civil action. Civil litigation can be very costly and often does not recover all of the actual losses.

This legislation would classify this action by unscrupulous loggers as theft that would fall under the same penalties that are provided for timber theft without the owners' consent. Basically, this bill changes the penalty from civil to criminal.

In the last three years in Burnett County (population 13,000) there are seven known cases of this type of timber theft. Many of the victims are elderly people on fixed income using the money gained from cut timber to pay their taxes. There are many more cases out there, and this legislation would help to ease the burden created by a dishonest logger.
