

The American Heart Association supports Assembly Bill 441.


The American Heart Association supports Assembly 441, relating to a smoke-free capitol building.

This legislation will improve the health and safety of workers and visitors to the State Capitol. Each year over 80,000 people take tours of the newly renovated Capitol. Not only does secondhand smoke pose a risk to the \$145 million spent in renovations to the capitol, but also everyone who works and visits the capitol is at risk from exposure to secondhand smoke, of which there is no safe level.

Secondhand smoke contains over 40,000 toxins. Each year exposure to secondhand smoke accounts for 53,000 deaths among nonsmokers. Even small amounts of exposure has health implications:

- ♥ Inhaling secondhand smoke from just one cigarette stiffens the aorta
- ♥ 20 minutes of exposure is equivalent to smoking one pack a day
- ♥ 30 minutes of exposure stiffens non-smokers arteries as much as smoking one pack of cigarettes, and reduces the body's ability to manage LDL cholesterol for several hours
- ♥ 2 hours of exposure results in an increased heart rate as well as increased chances of developing an irregular heartbeat.

This legislation will improve the health and safety of workers and visitors to the State Capitol. We urge you to pass Assembly Bill 411 and would like to thank you in advance for your consideration.

Secondhand smoke is the third leading cause of preventable death in this country, killing 53,000 nonsmokers in the United States each year. For every eight smokers who die from smoking related illness, one nonsmoker suffers the same fate.

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has classified secondhand smoke as a Group A Carcinogen, a substance known to cause cancer in humans. There are no safe levels of exposure for Group A toxins. The smoke from the burning end of a cigarette contains over 4,000 chemicals and 40 carcinogens including: formaldehyde, cyanide, arsenic, carbon monoxide, methane and benzene. The American Cancer Society believes it is only logical to afford protections to nonsmokers who do not wish to be exposed to this serious health risk.

As a public building which conducts the business of the people, the State Capitol is a facility that should be held to the highest of standards. With thousands of people each year visiting our Capitol, it behooves the State to provide a building, entrances included, that is safe for all.

The American Cancer Society urges you to act favorably on Assembly Bill 441 and would like to thank you in advance for your consideration.
