>nursing home on October 31, 2002. She had been in the nursing home for
>9 months. We feel as though we were able to help her die as she wished
>to die because there was a POA for Health Care in place. This enabled
>us to work with the medical profession and see to it that her wishes
>were respected. My 92 year old mother has been in a nursing home since

>February of this year. Again, we are working with her to set some
>direction for the remainder of her life. My wife's mother is 87 years
>old and lives in her own home at this time. However, we will stand by
>her wishes when the time comes.

> One of my volunteer functions is that of volunteer legal guardian.
> Currently I am guardian of seven people with developmental
>disabilities. I have been a volunteer guardian for many years and have
>been able to work through the deaths of several wards because POA's for
>Health care were in place. This enabled me to help meet the wards
>wishes during the very difficult times leading up to their deaths..

> Also, I have been a Hospice volunteer for many years. There isn't
>any doubt in my mind tht POA's for Health Care are of great benifit to
>families during the difficult time leading up to death. I have been
>with more than fifty families when they are trying to help thier loved

The bill referred to above recently came to my attention. Based on my experience as a hospital social worker in the oncology area, I think the proposed changes are not wise. We often see patients in the final phase of their life. In some cases, patients die a painful death from the spread of cancer or tumors caused by the cancer. Some are also given the option of having nutrition/hydration withheld and dying from this rather than the underlying illness. Those that have the option for this control, are allowed some peace of mind over a difficult future. Fortunately, it is not a decision I have had to make for myself or a family member. I oppose taking this right away from patients and the people they have designated to make decisions for them. I hope you and your committee will oppose it as well.

My name is Tricia Noriega and I work as the ICU/IMCU Social Worker at Meriter Hospital in Madison, WI. I am sending this e-mail to you because I'm very concerned about Assembly Bill 67, as amended by Assembly Substitute Amendment 1, which will affect Living Wills and Powers of Attorney for Health Care, among other things. It has been sent to the Senate. IT IS SCHEDULED FOR A HEARING ON TUESDAY, OCTOBER 7 at 10 a.m. before the Senate Health Committee.

CWAG (The Coalition of Wisconsin Aging Groups) opposes the bill because it dilutes the effectiveness of Living Wills and Powers of Attorney for Health Care, undermines the decision-making autonomy of individuals, and is unnecessary because the POA law already permits physicians to decline to follow a patient's wishes, as long as the physician makes a good faith attempt to transfer the patient to another physician who will comply. CWAG has a long history of positive change in our community and their interpretation of Assembly Bill 67 is warranted. As a hospital ICU Social Worker, I'm afraid that this Bill will prevent me from advocating for my patients. And perhaps more importantly, I'm concerned that the end-of-life experiences for patients everywhere in Wisconsin will become less dignified, less respectful and less humane.

I made my decisions after a long considerations of the outcomes. I do not want to have a hospital employee or other professional deciding for me that I should stay on a feeding tube. They don't know me or my family or even my wishes. This is why we have these **legal** documents in place. On a professional level I am the one who has to work with the client for many years. Most of my adult clients had nothing in place so extreme measures were taken. Some will continue to live a very long time, in a state that most of us wouldn't want to exist. They live in group homes, aren't able to work and cost the taxpayers on average 60, 000.00 a year. After the Doctors and hospital staff are done making the decisions, it is the spouse, family and county that have the long term follow through and responsibilities. Please don't pass this bill that would take away my right to make life decisions.

I am writing to share my concern over the possible long term effects of AB 67. As a health care professional who has worked in geriatric care for over 32 years in the hospital and now in the community setting in Adult Day Services, I have worked with numerous families and individuals who have and are concerned about end of life issues. Personally, I have assisted my parents and other family members to complete their POA for Health Care. Health care professionals, RNs and social workers, have spent endless amounts of time educating individuals on the Power of Attorney for Health Care.

I truly believe people want a choice in how they die. This does not mean they are depressed or mentally unbalanced. Many are looking forward to a greater life after death. They are ready. They have thought the process through and do not want to extend their death or dying unnecessarily. Current research in hospice care has determined that withholding fluids and/or nutrition does not cause increase suffering but actually the opposite....a state of euphoria is possible. The current status of the Power of Attorney for health care allows them to do this. Those individuals who want every effort to be made to prolong their life are also given the opportunity to say so in preparing their own POA. Please do not change the rules for us.

It is my experience that each person and each medical situation is looked at as a unique occurrence. Physicians already are permitted to decline to follow a patient's wish if in consult with the family and other health care professionals it seems the best choice at the moment.

Thank you for considering my thoughts in this most important topic.
