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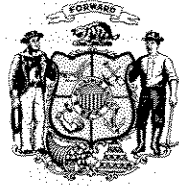

Since we are unable to attend the October 14th public hearing on this bill, we are writing to ask you and your committee to support this bill.

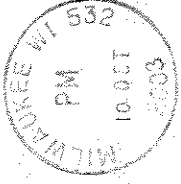
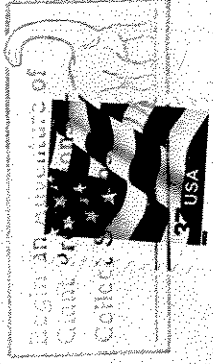

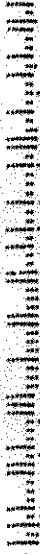
