The Family Planning Waiver has already helped over 31,000 Wisconsin women access basic and needed preventative and diagnostic reproductive health care, including screenings for breast and cervical cancer, annual check-ups, birth control, and testing and treatment for sexually transmitted infections.

As you know, the Family Planning Waiver was implemented January of 2003 to extend family planning services to low-income women aged 15-44 who are at high risk of unintended pregnancy because they do not have health coverage through Medicaid or BadgerCare. 
