Proposed changes to Senate Bill 225, November 17, 2003.

Change #1: Page 2 line 19 of Draft. Remove the words "No more than 10 of", and begin the sentence with "The credits.....". Add language to restrict courses to those that test and are conducted by nationally recognized organizations. Additionally, add language stating that the courses must be "relevant and related to the practice of Dental Hygiene".

Explanation: These changes would place *no limitation* on the number of CE credits that can be earned via self- study, correspondence or the internet, as long as those courses are from nationally recognized sources, credit(s) are awarded following testing and the courses are relevant and related to the practice of Dental Hygiene. There are currently several excellent courses available through electronic and self-study means available to dental hygienists. These courses are typically more academically rigorous when it comes to assessing comprehension and learning. Additionally, those hygienists who are located in the more remote parts of the state would benefit greatly from this section by not having to travel long distances to meet the CE requirement. The intent of this proposal is to maintain a high level of care in the profession through education, not to limit or restrict the access to that CE.

Change #2: Page 3 Line 10, Add sub-section (6) to allow instructors who are presenting, and or preparing for a CE presentation "relevant and related to the practice of dental hygiene" to earn the same credits as those receiving the instruction. The instructor may submit the course only once in the two-year renewal cycle for CE credit.

Explanation: This provision would allow dental hygienists who instruct the CE courses to receive CE credit for their work. Most states allow the presenters of CE courses to receive credit for the courses they teach.

Change #3: Page 3, Add sub-section (7) to provide a 6 to 1 ratio for college level courses "relevant and related to the practice of dental hygiene" toward CE credits. Therefore, for every one credit of college course work, individuals would earn 6 hours to go toward the 20 hour CE requirement.

Explanation: Both the American Dental Hygienists' Association and the Wisconsin Dental Hygienists' Association have policies in support of this element of the proposal. We believe that if a dental hygienist pursues additional education that is relevant and related to the practice of dental hygiene and at the college level, they should receive CE credits for that work.

Change # 4: Page 3, Line 4, sub-section 4, Credit for Volunteer activity should be "relevant and related to the practice of dental hygiene" and will be granted at a ratio of 4 to 1 hours. (Four hours of volunteering dental hygiene services would yield 1 CE credit)

- Bridget Duffy RDH, MD, John Duffy, DDS, and Robert Wathen were featured speakers September 9 in a continuing educational seminar in Madison, Wisconsin. They shared their expertise on "Oral Disease and its relationship to Health."
- Two Dental Hygiene Association nominees were appointed to serve the State of Wisconsin. DHAW appreciates those members willing to provide valuable public service.
 - The Wisconsin State Senate approved Catherine Schleis, RDH of Deforest, Wisconsin to assume a position on the Wisconsin Dentistry Examining Board. Catherine joins DHAW members David Carroll, RDH, and Nan Dreves, RDH, BS as dental hygiene members on the Wisconsin Dentistry Examining Board.
 - Midge Pfeffer, RDH, CDHC, was appointed to serve as a public member of the Joint Legislative Council, Special Committee on Dental Care Access.
- Dental Hygiene Association of Wisconsin launched a scientific, independently analyzed research study of the dental hygiene workforce. This was accomplished in cooperation with the Wisconsin Dental Association Workforce Study Group. (See synopsis)
- Dental Hygiene Association of Wisconsin (DHAW), Wisconsin Dental Association (WDA), and Wisconsin Dental Hygienists' Association (WDHA) collaborated on practice act changes that were proposed to and accepted by the Joint Legislative Council, Special Committee on Dental Care Access. 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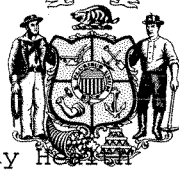

Tom, I understand that the continuing education requirements stated in this bill must be provided by a "nationally recognized" organization, which would eliminate many state and local organizations' continuing education programs. Our state dental hygiene organization Dental Hygiene Association of WI (DHAW) is not a national organization. We do however represent dental hygienists in Wisconsin, and have a particular interest in access to dental care for the underserved in our state and local communities. We also provide ongoing professional continuing education opportunities by professionals that are experts in their specific oral health field. For example, we recently presented a program called "Basic Functional Spanish for the Oral Health Provider" which trained 75 Dentists, Dental Hygienists, Dental Assistants and office personnel how to provide basic communication information to their Spanish-speaking patients. This was an excellent program presented by Voices for Health, Inc out of Michigan. There are many other programs that offer outstanding continuing education opportunities that may NOT be considered "nationally recognized." What will this mean for state and local programs that are bonafide venues for continuing education such as local agencies that provide our continued certification in CPR for example? The language in this bill appears to prohibit our organization and others from being recognized as a CE provider and our members and participants from using this resource for their CE requirements for licensure. Would you please ask Senator Schultz to check on this to prevent what appears to be an oversight in the language of this bill? SENATE BILL 225

Privileged and Confidential

Proposed changes to Senate Bill 225, November 17, 2003.

Change #1: Page 2 line 19 of Draft. Remove the words "No more than 10 of", and begin the sentence with "The credits.....". Add language to restrict courses to those that test and are conducted by nationally recognized organizations. Additionally, add language stating that the courses must be "relevant and related to the practice of Dental Hygiene".

Explanation: These changes would place *no limitation* on the number of CE credits that can be earned via self- study, correspondence or the internet, as long as those courses are from nationally recognized sources, credit(s) are awarded following testing and the courses are relevant and related to the practice of Dental Hygiene. There are currently several excellent courses available through electronic and self-study means available to dental hygienists. These courses are typically more academically rigorous when it comes to assessing comprehension and learning. Additionally, those hygienists who are located in the more remote parts of the state would benefit greatly from this section by not having to travel long distances to meet the CE requirement. The intent of this proposal is to maintain a high level of care in the profession through education, not to limit or restrict the access to that CE.

Change #2: Page 3 Line 10, Add sub-section (6) to allow instructors who are presenting, and or preparing for a CE presentation "relevant and related to the practice of dental hygiene" to earn the same credits as those receiving the instruction. The instructor may submit the course only once in the two-year renewal cycle for CE credit.

Explanation: This provision would allow dental hygienists who instruct the CE courses to receive CE credit for their work. Most states allow the presenters of CE courses to receive credit for the courses they teach.

Change #3: Page 3, Add sub-section (7) to provide a 6 to 1 ratio for college level courses "relevant and related to the practice of dental hygiene" toward CE credits. Therefore, for every one credit of college course work, individuals would earn 6 hours to go toward the 20 hour CE requirement.

Explanation: Both the American Dental Hygienists' Association and the Wisconsin Dental Hygienists' Association have policies in support of this element of the proposal. We believe that if a dental hygienist pursues additional education that is relevant and related to the practice of dental hygiene and at the college level, they should receive CE credits for that work.

Change # 4: Page 3, Line 4, sub-section 4, Credit for Volunteer activity should be "relevant and related to the practice of dental hygiene" and will be granted at a ratio of 4 to 1 hours. (Four hours of volunteering dental hygiene services would yield 1 CE credit)

2003 SENATE BILL 225

August 13, 2003 - Introduced by Senators ROESSLER, BROWN, HARSDORF, KANAVAS, LAZICH, SCHULTZ and ROBSON, cosponsored by Representatives FREESE, JESKEWITZ, GUNDERSON, HAHN, KREIBICH, J. LEHMAN, LOEFFELHOLZ, MILLER, MUSSER, OLSEN, OTT, OWENS, PETROWSKI, SERATTI, VAN ROY, VRAKAS, TAYLOR, HUBER, SHILLING and PLOUFF. Referred to Committee on Health, Children, Families, Aging and Long Term Care.

- 1 AN ACT *to amend* 447.05; and *to create* 447.055 of the statutes; **relating to:**
2 continuing education for dental hygienists.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, dental hygienists licensed by the Dentistry Examining Board (board) must apply to renew their licenses every two years. Under this bill, the board may not renew a license unless a dental hygienist attests that he or she has complied with continuing education requirements. In addition, when applying for renewal, a dental hygienist must attest that he or she has a current certification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation.

Regarding continuing education, the bill requires an applicant for renewal to attest that he or she has taught, attended, or otherwise completed, during the preceding two years, 20 credit hours of continuing education, including training in basic life support, cardiopulmonary resuscitation, and infection control. This requirement does not apply the first time that a person applies to renew a license, but applies the second time and each time thereafter. No more than two of the required 20 hours may be satisfied by training in basic life support or cardiopulmonary resuscitation, and no less than two of the hours must be satisfied by training in infection control. Also, no more than ten of the hours may be satisfied by self-study, correspondence, or Internet courses or programs. In addition, an applicant for renewal is allowed to substitute uncompensated hours of voluntary activities related to dental hygiene for no more than five of the hours.

Finally, the examining board may require submission of proof of compliance with the continuing education requirements. The board may require such proof on a random basis, or another basis determined by the board.

1 **SECTION 1.** 447.05 of the statutes is amended to read:

2 **447.05 Expiration and renewal.** Renewal applications shall be submitted

15 (a) Basic life support or cardiopulmonary resuscitation. No more than 2 of the
16 credit hours required under this subsection may be satisfied by such training.

17 (b) Infection control. No less than 2 of the credit hours required under this
18 subsection must be satisfied by such training.

19 **(2)** No more than 10 of the credit hours required under sub. (1) may be satisfied
20 by self-study, correspondence, or Internet programs or courses.
