## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

In Fiscal Year 2004 the Common School Fund received a total of \$16.6 million under Chapter 341 to 347, 349 and 351 and other fines and forfeitures. Assuming all fines and forfeitures meet the conditions of this bill then the State would have a decrease in revenue of \$3,089,067.47.

It is impossible to determine the exact fiscal impact of this bill because we do not know the amount of fines and forfeitures that are not collected within 120 days and we do not know how many county employees are employed by more than one county.
