ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT,
→ TO Assembly Substitute Amendment 1,
TO 2005 ASSEMBLY BILL 150

substitute amendment

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At the locations indicated, amend the bill as follows:

1. Page 1, line 3: after "campsites" insert ", using revenues generated from charging for certain electrical receptacles at Mirror Lake State Park for water quality improvement projects, and making an appropriation".

2. Page 1, line 4: before that line insert:

"SECTION 1b. 20.370 (4) (aw) of the statutes is created to read:

20.370 (4) (aw) *Water resources* — *Mirror Lake State Park*. All moneys received as fees for use of electrical receptacles under s. 27.01 (15) (c) for water quality improvement projects at Mirror Lake State Park under s. 27.01 (15) (c)."

3. Page 1, line 4: substitute "1m" for "1".

SECTION ← (B) (CS)

4. Page 2, line 13: after that line insert:

"SECTION 3. 27.01 (15) (c) of the statutes is created to read:

1 27.01 (15) (c) ~~Any~~^{All} revenues received by the department for charging fees for the
2 use of electric receptacles that are installed after the effective date of this paragraph
3 [...revisor inserts date] at Mirror Lake State Park shall be used for water quality
4 improvement projects for bodies of water that are located within Mirror Lake State
5 Park. The revenues may be used directly for these water quality improvement
6 projects or as matching funds for programs that provide funding for water quality
7 improvement projects. Any such revenues shall be credited to ^{the} appropriation under
8 s. 20.370 (4) (aw).”
