Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

SUMMARY OF BILL

This bill addresses various issues related to environmental claims under general liability insurance policies. The bill defines an environmental claim as a claim made by an insured under a general liability insurance policy for defense or indemnity based on the insured's liability or potential liability for bodily injury or property damage due to contaminated sediments or contaminated soils on the bed or banks of navigable waters of the state. For the purposes of this fiscal estimate, the only portion directly relevant to the Department of Natural Resources is creation of authority for the DNR to collect fees from a person who is responsible for removal of at least 10,000 tons of contaminated sediment from the bed or banks of a navigable water. The potential fee may not exceed \$0.25 per ton of material removed.

FISCAL IMPACT

A precise estimate of potential fees that may be authorized under this bill is not possible. Although there are more than one hundred contaminated sediment sites present in the state, few of these sites have been evaluated in enough detail in order to determine the method of remediation required, and if removal is required, the amount of sediment which will be required to be removed.

According to current estimates of contaminated sediment sites within the major harbors of the Great Lakes, and the rivers that flow into them, there are more than 8,000,000 tons of sediment that may be required to be removed over the next 15 years. If this sediment were to be removed at a consistent pace over the next 15 years, and if the maximum fee of \$0.25 per ton were to be assessed, the annual revenue generated would be approximately \$133,300. Under the bill, these funds would be deposited into a newly created solid waste management appropriation.

Technical Note

The bill creates a new appropriation in the Air/Waste Division, Program 2. This issue is more appropriately a Water Division issue and should be in Program 4.
