Changes include asking for \$1.4 million additional funding to add to the \$1.1 million in GPR already appropriated. (Assuming this will be appropriated) This would make a total of \$2.5 million for the health care apprenticeship grant program.

Working should be changed to reflect the changes on the bill copy attached.

A concern voiced about this bill is that the money will be channeled to the populous areas of the state and not to the needier areas, ie. Gabe's district. Any ideas on this?

Rep. Wieckert has agreed to allow Gabe to be the main author of this bill and Rep. Wieckert will be first co-sponsor.

Linda:

I have received your request to redraft 2003 AB 987 relating to local youth apprenticeship grants for health care training. In your request you voiced the concern that grant moneys would be channeled to populous areas and not to needy rural areas.

Actually, it is quite common for statutory language authorizing grant programs to require the department awarding the grant to award grants in both rural and urban areas or, at least, to consider the needs of both rural and urban areas in awarding grants. See *e.g.*, ss. 46.57 (3) (b), 46.86 (6) (b) 2., 46.95 (2) (b) 4., 48.982 (2) (a), 49.167 (2) (b), 118.43 (2) (e) 2., 165.93 (2) (c) 3., and 247.05 (2) (a) 2.

Accordingly, it would be no problem from a drafting standpoint to amend s.106.13 to include a requirement that DWD consider the needs of rural as well as urban areas in awarding youth apprenticeship grants.

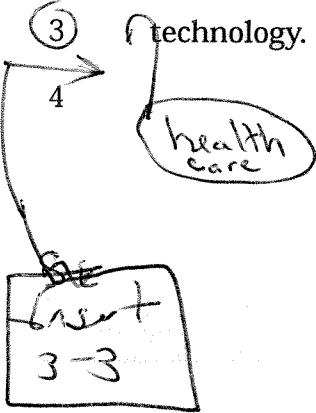

The biennial budget act establishes the appropriation schedule for the biennium. As such, that schedule may not be changed until the budget is enacted. Accordingly, this draft includes an effective date provision providing that the appropriation changes made in the draft take effect on the day after publication or on the day after the budget takes effect, whichever is later.

Because the budget bill repeals and recreates the entire appropriation schedule, theoretically it could repeal the local youth apprenticeship grant appropriation altogether, in which case the appropriation changes made by this draft would have no effect. Accordingly, you might wish to have this draft redrafted as a budget amendment or wait until after the budget is enacted to pursue enactment of this draft.
