This memorandum describes the attached draft substitute amendment, WLC: 0224/P1, to 2005 Assembly Bill 263 and 2005 Senate Bill 132 (which are companion bills).

The substitute amendment requires the employing political subdivision to reimburse a protective services officer (as defined) for reasonable attorney fees incurred by the officer in connection with a criminal proceeding, including an inquest, arising from the officer's conduct in the line of duty unless, in relation to that conduct: (1) the officer is convicted of a crime; (2) the officer's employment is terminated for cause; (3) the officer resigns for reasons other than retirement before the expenses are incurred; (4) the officer is demoted or reduced in rank; or (5) the officer is suspended without pay for 10 or more working days.

The following are among the differences between the substitute amendment and the original bill:

- 1. The substitute amendment only applies to reasonable attorney fees incurred in connection with a criminal proceeding and does not apply, for example, to expenses incurred in a disciplinary proceeding.
- 2. The substitute amendment requires a political subdivision to "reimburse ... reasonable attorney fees incurred," rather than "pay all reasonable expenses under sub. (1)."
- 3. The substitute amendment applies to an officer's conduct "in the line of duty," rather than to actions or charges against an officer in the officer's "official capacity" or to conduct "growing out of the performance of official duties." (See current s. 895.35, Stats.)

The draft is labeled "preliminary." You may wish to seek review and comment from interested parties before the substitute amendment is formally drafted.

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
