Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill makes extensive changes to existing regulations that cover the sales and contracts of cellular telephones. It requires the department to write rules regulating disclosures that must be made to a cellular customer, service area maps, and service quality reports that must be produced. The proposed bill also gives consumers the right to terminate contracts under certain conditions and prohibits certain practices relating to modifying contract conditions, charging termination fees and extending contracts.

It is assumed that writing the rules as required under this proposed bill will take two years and require 1.0 FTE of staff research and legal time at a of \$55,100 annually for two years. In year three an additional 4.0 FTE would be added to bring the full staff estimate to 5.0 FTE for administration of these new requirements.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

The department believes there are approximately 4 million cellular telephones in Wisconsin. If .1% of the state's cellular customers file complaints, it would result in an additional 4,000 complaints annually, an addition of over 20% to the existing complaint workload of the entire Bureau of Consumer Protection.

Those complaints would be expected to generate 60 in-depth investigations and 10 enforcement actions annually. This would require 5.0 FTE additional staff to enforce the law at an annual cost of \$301,000. The department assumes that the 1.0 FTE that was drafting the underlying rules would continue and an additional 4.0 FTE would begin in year 3 of this program and continue forward.
