Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The proposed legislation would, under certain circumstances, provide companies constructing electric transmission lines the ability to condemn county or municipal land. Under current statute, if a county or municipality is affected by such a line, the county or municipality is eligible for a one-time environmental impact fee. This fee is collected by DOA from the company which owns the line and is then paid to the affected counties and municipalities. Under this bill, DOA would retain the fee in cases where a negotiated settlement could not be reached and the property was condemned, or the negotiated payment for the property was higher than its assessed value. The amounts would be retained by DOA and used to offset low income assistance grants issued from the Public Benefits Fund.

There is insufficient information to determine the revenue that DOA would retain under this bill. However, the administrative costs of implementing this bill are expected to be minimal.
