The department shall determine the revised living wage by calculating the percentage difference between the consumer price index for the 12–month period ending on January 31 of the preceding year and the consumer price index for the 12–month period ending on January 31 of the current year, adjusting the living wage in effect on April 30 of the current year by that percentage difference,

and rounding that result to the nearest multiple of 5 cents. Notwithstanding s.
227.24 (1) (a), (2) (b), and (3), the department may promulgate an emergency rule
under s. 227.24 revising the living wage determined under sub. (1) without providing
evidence that the emergency rule is necessary to preserve the public peace, health,
safety, or welfare and without a finding of emergency. A revised living wage
determined under this paragraph shall first apply to wages earned on May 1 of the
year in which the living wage is revised.

(b) Paragraph (a) does not preclude the department from promulgating rules to increase the living wage as provided in s. 104.06.".

AN ACT...; relating to: indexing the living wage to the change in the consumer price index, providing an exemption from emergency rule procedures, providing an exemption from rule-making procedures, and granting rule-making authority

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Currently, the state minimum wage law requires that employers pay a living wage to their employees. Under that law, the Department of Workforce Development (DWD) has provided, by rule, minimum wages for various types of employees, including employees generally; opportunity employees, which are defined as employees under 20 years of age in their first 90 days of employment with a particular employer; tipped employees; agricultural employees; camp counselors; and golf caddies.

This bill requires DWD, by June 1 of each year, to promulgate rules revising the minimum wages provided by DWD by determining the percentage difference between the consumer price index for the preceding year and the consumer price index for the current year, adjusting the minimum wages and allowances in effect on May 31 of the current year by that percentage difference, and rounding that result to the nearest multiple of five cents.

For further information see the *state and local* fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.
