The bill provides that a person who is 10 or 11 years old may only hunt if he or she is within arm's reach of his or her parent or guardian, if the parent or guardian holds a current hunting approval of the type held by the

10-year-old or 11-year-old, and if the parent or guardian has been issued a certificate of accomplishment stating that the parent or guardian has successfully completed the course of instruction under the hunter education program issued by this state or another state. The bill specifies that the 10-year-old or 11-year-old, and the parent or guardian with whom he or she is hunting, may jointly have only one firearm or one bow in their possession or control while hunting.

Current law also imposes certain restrictions on firearm possession and control by persons who are under 16 years of age. Those restrictions vary depending on the person's age. This bill provides that a 10-year-old or 11-year-old may possess or control a firearm only if he or she is hunting within arm's reach of his or her parent or guardian or is enrolled in a hunter education course and possesses or controls the firearm in order to carry it to or from the course or to participate in the course.

Current law requires minors who are under 16 years old to be accompanied by a parent or guardian under certain circumstances when hunting or possessing a This bill provides that for these minors, except for 10-year-old or 11-year-old hunters, the parent or guardian may designate another person who is at least 18 years old to accompany the minor under these circumstances.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, no person under 12 years of age may hunt with a firearm or bow and arrow. This bill changes the minimum age for hunting to ten years of age, under certain circumstances. The bill provides that a person who is 10 or 11 years old may only hunt if he or she is within arm's reach of his or her parent or guardian, if the parent or guardian holds a current hunting approval of the type held by the

10-year-old or 11-year-old, and if the parent or guardian has been issued a certificate of accomplishment stating that the parent or guardian has successfully completed the course of instruction under the hunter education program issued by this state, another state, a province, or another country. The bill specifies that the 10-year-old or 11-year-old, and the parent or guardian with whom he or she is hunting, may jointly have only one firearm, one bow, or one crossbow in their possession or control while hunting.

Current law also imposes certain restrictions on firearm possession and control by persons who are under 16 years of age. Those restrictions vary depending on the person's age. This bill provides that a 10-year-old or 11-year-old may possess or control a firearm only if he or she is hunting within arm's reach of his or her parent, or guardian or is enrolled in a hunter education course and possesses or controls the firearm in order to carry it to or from the course or to participate in the course.

Current law requires minors who are under 16 years old to be accompanied by a parent or guardian under certain circumstances when hunting or possessing a firearm. This bill provides that for these minors except for 10-year-old or layear-old hunters, the parent or guardian may designate another person who is at least 18 years old to accompany the minor under these circumstances.

Current law contains an exception to the restrictions on the possession and control of a firearm for a person who is 12 years of age or older if the person hunts with a firearm or bow and arrow on land under that person's ownership or the ownership of the person's family, if no license is required, and if the firing of a firearm is allowed on that land. This bill expands this exception so that the exception also applies to a person who is 10 or 11 years of age and to a person qualified to hunt with a crossbow if the person otherwise meets the requirements for the exception. The bill also provides that the restrictions on possession and control of a firearm do not apply to a person who uses a firearm in target practice if he or she is accompanied by his or her parent or guardian or by a person who is at least 18 years old who is designated by the parent or guardian.

Current law generally prohibits hunting and firearm possession by any person under the age of 12. For persons who are older than 12 but under the age of 16, current law allows hunting and firearm possession but imposes certain restrictions that vary depending on the person's age. This bill makes various changes to the laws regulating hunting and firearm possession and control by persons under the age of 16.

Under current law, a person who is older than 12 but under the age of 16 may hunt or have a firearm in his or her possession or control if the person is accompanied by a parent or guardian and if he or she meets certain other requirements. This bill specifies that such a person may also hunt or have a firearm in his or her possession or control if the person is accompanied by a person who is at least 18 years old and who has been designated by the person's parent or guardian (designee).
