RE: Governor's Budget

Tonight at 7:00 the Governor will deliver his budget message which precedes the release of the 1000 plus page budget tomorrow. Since our meeting with the Governor in early fall we have pushed to have our language on *Sale to out of state person V.S.* "Non-resident" and Permits to individuals as well as an "individual" be included in the budget. We have been assured that the language was included. Ever skeptical, for the past two months we have pressed for verification because including our language in the budget didn't seem to make political sense; why should the Governor stick his neck out?

This morning Pat Henderson on the Governor's policy group verified that he had **no knowledge of the language being included**. He finally said what we always suspected, and that was that the **Governor would support stand alone legislation** when it landed on his desk.

Two avenues to pursue: The first is to ask Representative Mark Pettis (R) Town of La Follette to introduce a **budget amendment**. I will meet with him this afternoon to see if he will do it. A problem that we will have to overcome is that the budget is not supposed to contain policy items like ours and is to be directly related to state revenue. We will argue that our language will directly affect state sales tax collections.

The other action (higher likelihood of success) is to introduce a **stand alone bill** that can be placed on the Governor's desk. Potential bill sponsors:

As you all know, a stand alone bill requires hearings in both houses. This means more work for us, but we have done it before only to be vetoed by former Governor McCallum. With Governor Doyle, this should not be a problem.

I, therefore, have eliminated any reference to residents and nonresidents in s. 167.10 (3) (c) 6.
