AN ACT ...; relating to: free access to state parks and state trails by certain

disabled veterans and former prisoners of war.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Currently, most vehicle entering state parks must have a vehicle admission receipt(sticker), either for annual use or for aday use. Some vehicles are exempt from having a sticker, including vehicles operated by a unit of government, vehicles occupied by an adult holding a conservation patron license, vehicles occupied by a person who holds a senior citizen recreation card, and vehicles operated for transporting pupils of a public or private school. This bill adds to those exemptions vehicles occupied by a resident who is a veteran with a 70 percent or greater military-related disability and vehicles occupied by a resident who was a prisoner of war.

Currently, a fee is charged for admission to Heritage Hill State Park and to state trails. There are exemptions from the admission fee, including persons who hold a senior citizen recreation card and adults holding a conservation patron license. This bill adds to those exemptions residents who are veterans with a 70 percent or greater military-related disability and residents who were prisoners of war.

For further information see the state and local fiscal estimate, which will be printed as an appendix to this bill.
