Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The bill requires the DATCP to create a family and school communications protection registry. A parent, guardian, or legal custodian of a minor may request that DATCP include in the registry an electronic mail address, a wireless telephone number, or certain other electronic contact information (contact points) that pertain to the person making the request or to the minor. The bill would prohibit sending restricted messages to a contact point that has been registered for more than 30 days. The bill would also permit an administrator or a school or state institution that primarily serves minors to register an Internet domain name associated with the school or institution, if a minor may obtain an electronic mail address that contains the domain name.

Under the bill DATCP must charge a fee for the verification procedure not to exceed one-half of one cent for each contact point processed. Eighty percent of these fees collected are appropriated to DATCP for the administration and enforcement of the registry.

According to the 2005-2006 Wisconsin Blue Book, Wisconsin has approximately 1 million school aged children who would be eligible to register a contact point. It is assumed that each minor would have access to at least two contact points, which would result in over 2 million registrations.

Based on these assumptions, DATCP would need 2 Consumer Protection Investigators to administer and enforce this law at a cost of \$124,400. In addition to the FTEs, DATCP would require start up costs of \$100,000. These start up costs include hiring 1 FTE for one-year to establish and publicize the registry and to contract with a third party to create and operate the verification procedure and the reporting mechanism. It is known that there are some third party contractors who have zero start-up costs and take an annual percentage of the fees charged for "scrubbing" solictors' lists. We estimate those costs to be about \$30,000.

The bill also requires DATCP to promulgate rules establishing a procedure by which a person who wishes to send a restricted message to a contact point may verify that the contact point is not a registered contact point or an electronic mail address that contains a registered domain name. The one-year FTE would also be responsible for the additional work that comes with drafting a rule.

These costs would eventually be offset by program revenue generated by processing solicitors' lists to remove registered contact points. Based on very limited information from other states, it is assumed that approximately 10 lists will be "scrubbed" on a monthly basis. If the average list contains 250,000 contacts, this activity should generate \$150,000 annually in program revenue, thus covering the cost of 2 FTEs to run the program and the third party contract expenses.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

Over the long range, the revenue generated from solicitors' "scrubbing" their lists should cover the costs associated with 2 FTEs to run the program.
