we need to decide who will draft which resolution and joint resolution needed for the beginning of session. I have no problem having my initials last or not on these drafts.

They are:

Assembly organization: a request for an assembly resolution needs to be entered and a /P1 created by running the redraft maker on 2003 AR 1 (03-1051/1).

Assembly committee structure changes (senate committees are created by leaders): a request for an assembly resolution needs to be entered and a /P1 created by running the redraft maker on 2003 AR 2 (03-1106/1).

Senate organization: a request for a senate resolution needs to be entered and a /P1 created by running the redraft maker on 2003 SR 1 (03-1050/1).

these three are easy

Session schedule: a request for a senate joint resolution needs to be entered and a /P1 created by running the redraft maker on 2003 SJR 1 (03-1262/3)

A long detailed dnote based on the dnote in the file for 2003 SJR1 needs to be created. The /P2 draft is the same as the enrolled final session schedule update to fit with this year's days/dates. (moved a few dates earlier or later to match up with the Tuesday-Thursday floorperiods) . The dnote has to identify the holidays

and religious days so leaders can decide how to structure the floorperiods. The drafter(s) of this one need to review the drafting file of the last or the last two session schedules carefully to be able to include the important information in the dnote (look at the last or first pages of your desk calendar and the web). Quite often, the LRB has presented the information visually on a calendar. See the drafting file.
