2	Whereas, February is Black History Month, giving all citizens an opportunity
3	to recognize and celebrate the contributions African-Americans have made to
4	Wisconsin, the United States, and the world; and
5	Whereas, during the Civil War a substitution and bounty system was
6	established, allowing states to hire nonresidents and substitutes to meet their draft
7	quotas for soldiers in the Union Army; and
8	Whereas, hundreds of African-Americans, including freemen and escaped
9	slaves, were hired as substitutes and took the place of Wisconsin residents in combat,
10	despite the fact that many of these African–Americans had never set foot in the state
11	of Wisconsin; and
12	Whereas, many of these African–American troops substituting for Wisconsin
13	residents served in Company F of the 29th Infantry of U.S. Colored Troops, 9th Army
14	Corps, 4th Division, in the 2nd Brigade in the Army of the Potomac; and

1	Whereas, the men of Company F of the 29th USCT served with distinction and
2	valor on behalf of Wisconsin, seeing action in the Battle of the Crater, the Petersburg
3	Campaign, the Bermuda Hundred Campaign, the Richmond Campaign, the
4	Appomattox Campaign, and the Rio Grande Campaign; and
5	Whereas, after the Civil War a small number of the surviving members of the
6	29th USCT returned without fanfare to live and work the remainder of their lives in
7	Wisconsin; now, therefore, be it
