

**ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 20,  
TO 2005 ASSEMBLY RESOLUTION 6**

September 27, 2005 – Offered by Representative SCHNEIDER.

1 At the locations indicated, amend the resolution as follows:

2 **1.** Page 3, line 11: after that line insert:

3 “**SECTION 5m.** Assembly rule 32 (1) (a) is amended to read:

4 ASSEMBLY RULE 32 (1) (a) Except as otherwise provided in this paragraph,  
5 messages from the senate or from the governor may be received and read, and any  
6 proposal referenced in the messages that is a senate proposal initially received for  
7 consideration of the assembly shall be referred and any other proposals referenced  
8 in the messages shall be taken up immediately unless referred by the presiding  
9 officer to a standing committee or to the calendar. Any messages from the senate  
10 referring to a senate joint resolution memorializing Congress or any branch or officer  
11 of the federal government that is received for consideration of the assembly may be  
12 read but the senate joint resolution may not be received for consideration.—The,  
13 unless the senate joint resolution memorializes Congress or any branch or officer of

1 the federal government to oppose the privatization of social security. Any senate  
2 joint resolution that does not memorialize Congress or any branch or officer of the  
3 federal government to oppose the privatization of social security shall be transmitted  
4 to the senate immediately after the message is read;”.

5 **2.** Page 3, line 19: after that line insert:

6 “**SECTION 7m.** Assembly rule 39 (1) is amended to read:

7 ASSEMBLY RULE 39 (1) Except as otherwise provided in joint rule 83 (2) and this  
8 subsection, any member or standing committee may introduce or offer proposals in  
9 the assembly on any day of the biennial legislative session. No member or standing  
10 committee may offer any assembly joint resolution or resolution memorializing  
11 Congress or any branch or officer of the federal government, unless the assembly  
12 joint resolution or resolution memorializes Congress or any branch or officer of the  
13 federal government to oppose the privatization of social security.”.
