Marlin has an assembly resolution removing the prohibition against offering resolutions telling the federal government what to do. That one is fine.

Now he wants a series of assembly resolutions leaving that in the rules but with an exception, (nine separate resolutions, each providing one exception)

1. exception for military base closing that impact the state of Wisconsin or its residents or economy.

2. exception for outsourcing of American or Wis jobs to foreign countries.

3. importation of prescription drugs from Canada.

4. pay equity for women

5. prohibiting congressional leaders under indictment from continuing to serve as leaders.

6. determine why national guard members in Iraq are dying at a faster rate than regular army

7. treatment of American soldiers in Iraq who have been charged with theft for using metal from broken equipment to reinforce our vehicles (Cong. Green; Alabama Nat Guard also)

8. Sec of defense using machine to sign letters notifying relatives of killed soldiers of their death.

9. US government buying American products and encouraged to do more

Here is a separate resolution: If travel by legislators to any meeting of a national organization funded primarily by taxpayers is prohibited by assembly, then all travel to ALEC and any other organization funded primarily by special interests is also prohibited.

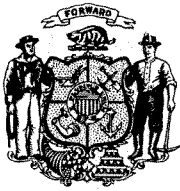

## 2005 ASSEMBLY RESOLUTION

GEN

1 **Relating to:** the prohibition against memorializing the federal government.

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### *Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau*

Currently, in the assembly rules, there exists a prohibition against the offering of any assembly joint resolution or resolution memorializing Congress or any branch or officer of the federal government, a prohibition against the assembly receiving a senate joint resolution memorializing Congress or any branch or officer of the federal government, and a requirement that each such senate joint resolution must be transmitted back to the senate immediately after the message referring to the senate joint resolution is read. This resolution exempts from these rules any joint resolution or resolution that memorializes Congress or any branch or officer of the federal government to require pay equity for women in the United States.

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2 **Resolved by the assembly, That:**

3 **SECTION 1.** Assembly rule 32 (1) (a) is amended to read:

4 ASSEMBLY RULE 32 (1) (a) Except as otherwise provided in this paragraph,  
5 messages from the senate or from the governor may be received and read, and any  
6 proposal referenced in the messages that is a senate proposal initially received for  
7 consideration of the assembly shall be referred and any other proposals referenced  
8 in the messages shall be taken up immediately unless referred by the presiding

1 officer to a standing committee or to the calendar. Any messages from the senate  
2 referring to a senate joint resolution memorializing Congress or any branch or officer  
3 of the federal government that is received for consideration of the assembly may be  
4 read but the senate joint resolution may not be received for consideration ~~unless the~~ <sup>Ⓢ The ←</sup>  
5 senate joint resolution memorializes Congress or any branch or officer of the federal  
6 government to require pay equity for women in the United States. ~~The~~ <sup>↙</sup> Any senate  
7 joint resolution that does not memorialize Congress or any branch or officer of the  
8 federal government to require pay equity for women in the United States shall be  
9 transmitted to the senate immediately after the message is read;

10 **SECTION 2.** Assembly rule 39 (1) <sup>✓</sup> is amended to read:

11 ASSEMBLY RULE 39 (1) Except as otherwise provided in joint rule 83 (2) and this  
12 subsection, any member or standing committee may introduce or offer proposals in  
13 the assembly on any day of the biennial legislative session. No member or standing  
14 committee may offer any assembly joint resolution or resolution memorializing  
15 Congress or any branch or officer of the federal government, unless the assembly  
16 joint resolution or resolution memorializes Congress or any branch or officer of the  
17 federal government to require pay equity for women in the United States. <sup>✓</sup>
