STATE OF WISCONSIN

RESOLUTION BY THE LEGISLATURE

WISCONSIN MARITIME MUSEUM

Maritime Museum

WHEREAS, the Manitowoc Submarine Memorial Association was formed in 1968 to bring a World War II Manitowoc-built submarine to the City of Manitowoc in order to show to the world the fine work done by the Manitowoc Shipbuilding Company and its employees during World War II; and

WHEREAS, a dedicated and visionary group of community leaders founded the Manitowoc Maritime Museum in 1969 to receive a submarine from the Department of the Navy; and

WHEREAS, USS COBIA, a submarine of the type built in Manitowoc, arrived in Manitowoc on August 17, 1970, and hosted the first Submariners' Memorial Service onboard on August 7, 1971; and

WHEREAS, now, on its 35th anniversary in Manitowoc, USS COBIA is the "Nation's Most Completely Restored WWII Submarine" and the maritime museum, now named Wisconsin Maritime Museum, is acknowledged as the finest maritime museum on the Great Lakes, having been visited by more than 1 million people; and

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Maritime Museum is dedicated to the preservation and interpretation of local, state, and regional maritime history; and

WHEREAS, the founders, veterans, volunteers, and community of Manitowoc have created, as a gift to the nation, the Wisconsin Maritime Museum, a facility of 60,000 square feet with a state-of-the-art computerized classroom, the "Learning Adventure Center," Children's Waterways Room, a unique watercourse model of the Great Lakes and locks system; 12 exhibit galleries; climate-controlled, state-of-the-art 1,500 square-foot library and archives facility containing 350 ship's logs and 200 maps, a photographic collection of 40,000 images, 2,000 blueprints, 8,000 books and approximately 2,000 periodicals, and one of the largest intact collections of World War II submarine blueprints; a film library of more than 800 items, including one-of-a-kind World War II color film footage; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin Maritime Museum's Library & Archives annually responds to more than 150 research and photo requests from scholars, authors, historical institutions, and other individuals and hosts interns and researchers from a variety of graduate and undergraduate programs throughout the State of Wisconsin and elsewhere; and

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Maritime Museum, its archives, collections, and "Wisconsin-Built Boat Gallery" preserve and honor the great craft and tradition of boat building in Wisconsin, as exemplified in the past by such manufacturers as Thompson Boat Company of Peshtigo, Dan

WHEREAS, in 1990 the Wisconsin Maritime Museum was awarded Accreditation by the American Association of Museums, the highest professional designation a museum can receive, and was the first maritime museum on the Great Lakes to be so honored; and *je*

WHEREAS, in 1991, the Wisconsin Maritime Museum was elected into membership of the International Congress of Maritime Museums and is a member of the Council of American Maritime Museums; and *je*

WHEREAS, in 2005, the Wisconsin Maritime Museum became the only museum in Wisconsin and in the North Central States and the only maritime museum on the Great Lakes to be named an affiliate of the Smithsonian, earning access to Smithsonian national collections and its expertise and ability to develop educational and programmatic initiatives; *now therefore be it*

Per my voicemail from yesterday, I will be sending a packet over to you with a page sometime today. There are two resolutions that Senator Leibham would like to have drafted.

The first is basically a re-draft of 1995 AJR 4. An amendment was submitted but I don't know if it is needed this time. I'm willing to let you use your best judgment on that one.

The second resolution is to recognize the Manitowoc Maritime Museum as the State of Wisconsin's Maritime Museum. There are two changes that need to be made that are not reflected on the hard copy I am sending to you:

1 - Please add this "Whereas" clause: ~~WHEREAS~~ the Wisconsin Maritime Museum will honor the maritime heritage of the State's Native American people, who first developed the region's rich fisheries, water transportation, and fur trade.

2 - Please add "and inland" to the Resolved clause as follows: "BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, That from this day henceforth, the Wisconsin Maritime Museum shall be known also as the "State of Wisconsin's Maritime Museum," bestowing honor on all those who have had a hand in its creation and care and expressing to the nation the Museum's role in preserving and displaying the unique heritage of the people of Wisconsin and their relationship with our Great Lakes and inland lakes, rivers, and streams."

Received the draft for LRB 3569. Have just a few minor changes that the constituent asked for:

[Page 1, lines 7, 8] "Department of the Navy" should be capitalized in the second "whereas."

[Page 1, line 9] In referring to the submarine, the word "the" before the boat's name should be omitted. Accepted form is simply, "WHEREAS, USS *Cobia*, a submarine of the type..."


[Page 3, line 15] In the last "WHEREAS," we should have written "...an affiliate of the Smithsonian Institution..." [We omitted the word "institution."]
