10	Whereas, "Fighting Bob" Anderson served the citizens of the 13th Aldermanic
11	District of the city of Milwaukee for 32 years; and
12	Whereas, Robert Anderson will always be known as a true champion of the
13	people by those he represented; and
14	Whereas, Robert Anderson served the citizens of Milwaukee as president of the
15	Milwaukee Common Council from 1980 to 1984; and

1	Whereas, Bob Anderson retired from the common council in 1996 after 3
2	decades of zealous, plain-spoken advocacy on behalf of his constituents; and
3	Whereas, Robert Anderson is survived by his loving wife, Sylvia, and devoted
4	children, Dennis Anderson, Suzanne Slaby, Kathleen Amrhein, and John Anderson;

6	Whereas, Bob Anderson is widely respected as a statesman, a family man, and
7	friend, whose leadership and dedication will be greatly missed; now, therefore, be it
8	Resolved by the senate, the assembly concurring, That the members of the
9	Wisconsin legislature commend the devoted public service Robert A. Anderson
10	contributed to his community, express their sorrow at his death, and extend their
11	condolences to his family and friends; and, be it further
