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

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


PG ✓ a. *General School Aids Funding Level (LFB Paper #595)*. Adopt Alternative 1, which would approve the Governor's recommendation to provide \$285 million GPR in 2005-06 and \$415 million GPR in 2006-07 for general school aids.

PG ✓ b. *Revenue Limit Enrollment Average (LFB Paper #598)*. Adopt Alternatives A1, B1, and C1, which would: (1) approve the Governor's recommendation to provide that, beginning in 2006-07, a school district's revenue limit would be the greater of the limit calculated using either a three-year or a five-year rolling average pupil enrollment; (2) beginning in 2005-06, extend the one-year 75% declining enrollment provision which applies in the year of an enrollment decline to include a 50% adjustment in the year after the decline and a 25% adjustment in the second year after the decline; and (3) beginning in 2005-06, provide that if a district's initial revenue limit in the current year is less than the district's base revenue in the prior year, the district's initial limit be set equal to the prior year's base.

Under current law, base level funding for the SAGE program is \$95,029,600 GPR, and the per pupil payment is \$2,000 per low-income child enrolled in grades K-3. Class sizes must be reduced to 15 pupils to one teacher in grades K-3. Base level funding for special education is \$320,771,600 GPR. Base level funding for bilingual-bicultural aid is \$8,291,400 GPR, and schools are eligible for aid if the school enrolls 10 or more pupils in a language group in grades K-3, or 20 or more in grades 4-8 or 9-12.

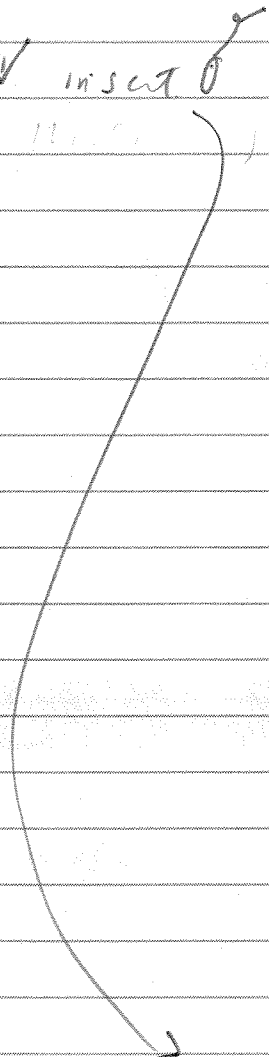

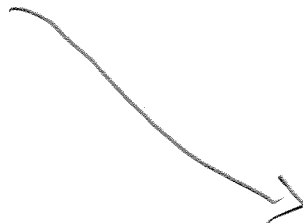
