Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill would allow the operation of double-deck buses up to 14'5" in height on roadways with posted speed limits of 45 miles per hour or less, without the need for a permit for excessive height, as long as the bus operator coordinates with the government agency responsible for maintenance of the highway of the vehicle's proposed route to ensure there is adequate height clearance.

There is no permit required for these buses, so there is no workload implication for the Division of Motor Vehicles Motor Carrier Services Section.

The bill holds owners of double-deck buses liable to the highway maintenance authority for any damage to a highway, overhead structure, or device above the highway that may be caused by the the height of the bus. So, there is no cost implication for the Division of Transportation Infrastructure Development.
