Attached is a bill draft prepared at your request--WLC: 0001/1, relating to including prescription drugs and supplies for other chronic diseases in the cancer drug repository program and requiring the exercise of rule-making authority.

The draft modifies the current cancer drug repository program to include drugs for other chronic diseases and supplies needed to administer those drugs. The term "chronic disease" is defined by using the definition in current s. 255.01 (1), Stats., but does not include the words "is reversible and" since, as was discussed at our June 24, 2004 meeting, certain diseases that might commonly be considered to be chronic diseases are reversible.

The current statute on the cancer drug repository defines the term "cancer drug." The draft expands this to define the term "cancer or other chronic disease drug or supplies." By including the term "supplies" in the definition to mean supplies that are needed to administer such a drug, it is not necessary to repeat the phrase "needed to administer a cancer drug" throughout the statute, as is done in the current statute.

In addition, the draft corrects what appears to be an error in the current statute that deals with immunity from liability for persons other than drug manufacturers. The immunity provision refers to drugs or supplies. However, the exception to that immunity, which allows liability to be imposed for reckless, wanton, or intentional misconduct, refers only to drugs. The draft adds supplies to that exception.
