AN ACT *to create* 20.255 (2) (ae) and 121.07 of the statutes; **relating to:**ratification of the agreement negotiated between the state of Wisconsin and the
Wisconsin State Employees Union, AFSCME Council 24, and its appropriate
affiliated locals, AFL-CIO, for the 2003–05 biennium, covering employees in
the security and public safety collective bargaining unit, authorizing an
expenditure of funds, additional aid to school districts, and making an
appropriation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 20.005 (3) (schedule) of the statutes: at the appropriate place, insert the following amounts for the purposes indicated:

expenditure of moneys for implementation from the appropriations made by section 20.865 (1) of the statutes, subject to section 20.865 (intro.) of the statutes. The director of the office of state employment relations shall file an official copy of the agreement, certified by the cochairpersons of the joint committee on employment relations, with the secretary of state. No formal or informal agreement between the parties that is not a part of the official copy is deemed to be approved by the legislature under this act.

SECTION 5. Effective date.

(1) Section 4 of this act takes effect on the day following publication, except that those provisions specifically identified as having other effective dates in the agreement covering employees in the security and public safety collective bargaining unit are effective on the dates provided in that agreement.
