

Under current law, before January 1, 2008, one nonstock health benefit purchasing cooperative (cooperative) may be organized in each of five geographic areas of the state that are designated by the Commissioner of Insurance (commissioner) by order. The purpose of the cooperatives is to provide health care benefits to the employees, members, and officers of the members of each cooperative and to their dependents through a three vear contract with an insurer. ✓ Each cooperative must submit to the legislature and to the commissioner an annual report on the progress of the health benefit purchasing arrangement and, within a year after the end of the three vear contract term, a report on the significant findings from the project, including the effects on group heath care coverage premiums and the number of uninsured in the geographic area of the cooperative.

This bill removes the limits on the project so that any number of cooperatives may be organized anywhere in the state to provide health care benefits to their employees, members, officers, and dependents. The cooperatives are no longer required to be organized before January 1, 2008, and contracts with insurers are no longer required to be, or limited to, three years in length. Each cooperative that forms is required to report annually to the legislature and to the commissioner on the progress of the health benefit purchasing arrangement and on the findings that, under current law, are required to be addressed in a cooperative's final report at the end of the three-year contract. All other features of the project are the same as under current law.
